Welcome back! This half term we will be learning all about farm animals.

#### Curriculum Overview

English -Using the Read Write Inc. scheme, we will continue to learn sounds and to blend these sounds to read simple words. We will continue to learn the tricky words too. We will also be focussing on children using their phonic knowledge to write simple sentences.

Maths - We will be learning to count with confidence from 1-20, using objects to add and subtract numbers and solve problems using doubling, halving and sharing. In addition, we will be focusing on size, weight and money. This will all be linked to our topic "Farm animals".

**PE** - This term we have two PE lessons. Our PE on a Thursday morning will focus on building team skills. On Friday, we will be learning Dance with Beth.

## Reading

Please write in your child's reading record book each time your child reads their school book. Remember our expectation is to be reading at home three times a week.

Children's books will only be changed when they are confident with their book, this includes answering questions about their book as well as being able to read it fluently.
