Please encourage and support your child in the completion of homework set. You are partners in your child's education and have agreed through our home school agreement to support your child in this way. Head Lice

Please inform school via the office if your child has a case of head lice so that we can inform the class's parents.

Please do not take offence, head lice like clean hair! If we do inform you that there has been a case reported, please do check your child's hair carefully, they can be difficult to spot especially if they are at the egg stage. The advice is to treat when live lice can be seen. If your child has head lice, you do not need to keep your child off school once you have treated him/her.
