Trips

In preparation for this summer's performance, Year 5 and 6 enjoyed a fabulous day out at the Nottingham Theatre Royal watching a fabulous performance of The Jungle Book. No pressure Year 5 and 6!

Next week, Year 3 will be travelling to Hull to visit The Deep which will really enhance the children's learning associated with the topic this term.

We also ask for voluntary contributions to cover the cost of transport and for trips which are not a direct National Curriculum requirement – for example, school pays for the swimming lessons, parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of travel.

However, trips such as The Deep or the theatre visit act to enhance the learning of our pupils and provide a breadth to their understanding – these are not statutory requirements, therefore we do ask for voluntary contributions to help cover the cost.

If at any time we find that the lack of contributions would result in the school not being able to cover the difference, trips will be cancelled and money returned.

Data Protection- GDPR

As some of you may be aware, new data protection legislation is coming into force in May this year (GDPR). This has huge implications for all schools as data is held for various reasons and by various companies on our behalf – for example Innovate, our food providers.

Please support us when we send requests home for permissions especially for swimming, sporting events, after school classes and trips.

We have to have a definite yes or no when we ask for your permission, in writing.

We cannot presume because you have not said no that this means you do agree or vice versa. Thank you.

School Drop Off

On some occasions it has been noticed that children are arriving before 8.45am and the area around the steps is becoming quite congested.

Please reinforce with your child that they are still expected to behave sensibly and not to climb on the bars or run around, even if you are leaving them to wait by themselves.

Also, a reminder that it is illegal to park on the zig zag lines outside school from 8am, so if you are bringing your child to breakfast club you should not park here.

The route into school is very busy at this time with staff arriving and by parking here you are reducing the visibility for drivers.
