### **September Arrangements**

School will be open to **all** and **all** pupils are expected to attend daily.

We have made initial plans based on the current information we have from the government.



Gates will be open from 8.45am until 9.15am in the mornings to hopefully avoid queues and allow for social distancing whilst dropping children off.

Your child/ren will enter their classes from their outside / fire door. The register will then be taken.

Please inform us promptly if your child is absent, especially if they walk/cycle to school by themselves as there is quite a gap in time for us to react if something has occurred on the way to school.

Similarly at the end of the day you may collect your child/ren from 3.15pm. All should be collected by 3.30pm please.



There will be the one way system in operation still, so enter the school premises via the front gate and exit via the back gate and down the steps, taking care to socially distance at all times.

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Please remember to tell anyone who is dropping off or picking up your child this rule as well.



Try to limit to one adult with your child/ren and keep your child/ren with you – do not allow them to run off and invade someone else's space.

Please be kind and realise that some families returning in September will have been shielding or sticking to strict guidance since March.

We all have had different experiences and are at different stages in getting back to normal.



Your child/ren will need a waterproof coat everyday whatever the weather, please. Breaks will be taken outside unless it is pouring down.

Also PE kits should be in school daily so that your child can get changed if needed.

Uniform needs to be worn from September. Don't forget to put names on PE kits as well as clothes.

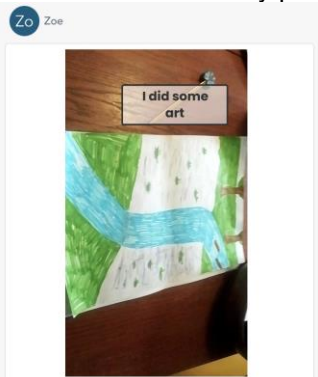
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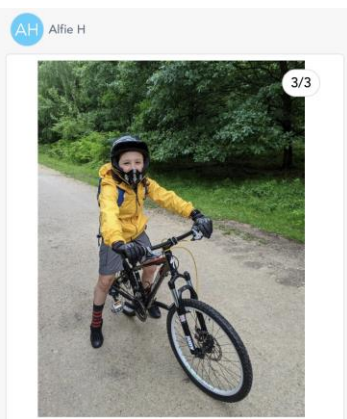
