Road Safety

This week I received a letter from a resident in Lea who has concerns about the safety of pedestrians in the village. I have been made aware that there is only one specified place for pedestrians to cross the busy main road and this is not particularly well highlighted to motorists. I have always been concerned about the crossing point at the bottom of Willingham Road Hill.

The speed limit on the main road is 40mph which is again a concern.

There have been several accidents recently on Lea Road which has heightened our awareness of the dangers.

We do have a number of pupils who cycle and walk to school by themselves which is great to see; we all want to reduce pollution and have our children more active.

I shared the concerns raised with a group of year 5 and 6 pupils, together with the older members of the school council. They are starting a project to try and influence decision makers into putting some actions into place to make Lea a safer place for the both pedestrians and cyclists.

If you have any ideas to help us with this project, please get in touch. Let's get together as a community as that approach is most likely to be listened to.

We must support our children, who are leading this, as they are our future.
