



2015-2016 Pupil Premium Statement

For the 2015/16 financial year we expect to receive £45,500 in Pupil Premium funding. Last year we carried forward £16,613 so in total we expect to have £62,113 available. It has been agreed by the full Governing Body and the Head Teacher that the money will be spent as follows.
