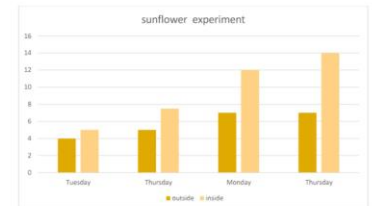

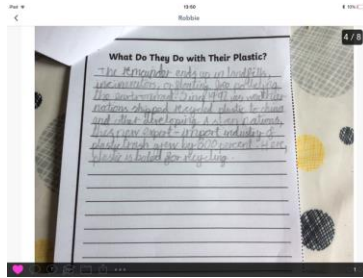

Florence Nightingale

20 - 13 August 1910 Florence Nightingale also known as the lady with the lamp, Italy to wealthy parents - William and Fanny Nightingale, she also had names Parthenope, better known as POP.

tingale was a wealthy banker and was able to provide his family with a very big house and two houses, one in Hampshire for the Summer and Spynshire for Autumn and Winter.

During times in Britain, wealthy women were expected to not attend work, their duty was to look after the family and house, reading, sewing and attending to the needs of the family. But Florence wasn't your average woman, at the age of 16, she was told a message from god saying she needs to carry out important work to help

her family, they were very disapproving and didn't expect her to work. They said nursing was not a respectable career to pursue, not to mention, most certainly not a place for a rich woman to be. William tried to change her mind, but she wouldn't have it. She was determined.

She gave in and let Florence study nursing at a Christian school for women in Germany to learn necessary skills in caring for patients and the importance of maintaining

her skills to the test, by then she was running a women's hospital where she did a fantastic job improving staff conditions as well as patient care.
