Yr 2 – Pedestrian safety training.



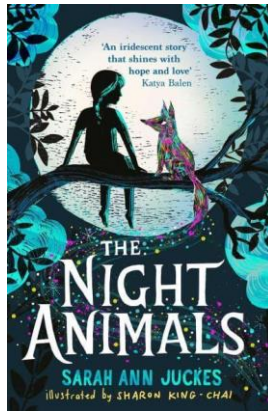
