


Writing



Give children opportunities to use spoken language and a rich vocabulary to articulate the skills they have learnt and write these ideas down.

Raise the standards in handwriting and presentation so that children take pride in their written work.

Have a consistent approach to the teaching of spelling so that children find links between words through the use of morphology, etymology, orthography etc

Develop fluency and flow to writing that develops through the years.

Ensure progress across all year groups by providing a rich and varied range of texts to inspire writing.

SEND

The writing journey is carefullu structured to allow success for all learners. Children are given time to build on previous learning and practise new skills to try and decrease cognitive overload. Our teaching incorporates Kagan principles which allows children to share ideas and orally rehearse sentences. Support is identified in order to remove barriers to learning for children.

IMPLEMENTATION— How do we achieve our INTENT?



Writing is planned in clear sequence to ensure clear progression of skills across all year groups. Children are given a purpose to their writing which is built up in clear steps resulting in a final piece. Children are given time to orally rehearse writing and are taught the grammar needed. Children are given the opportunities to write in a range of different genres and for a variety of purposes. Handwriting and spelling are planned for with a clear progression across all year groups. Quality, vocabulary rich texts are used as a basis for all writing ensuring there is a clear purpose and inspiration for all written pieces.

EYFS

In the EYFS children take part in drawing club. Vocabulary is introduced in a contextual way linked to a different story each week. Children are encouraged to verbalise their ideas and writing and to orally rehearse their sentences.

Phonics lesson encourage the recognition of letters and teaches the correct formation. They then spell words by segmenting sounds and representing these sound with a letter. Finally the children will be able to write simple phrases and sentences.

Assessment

Assessment is an integral part of our writing journey. Teachers are constantly assessing at the point of learning in order to move children on. Children are involve in their own assessment at the point of writing through the drafting and editing process which is supported through peer and teacher feedback.

Moderation of writing takes place internally to ensure teachers are clear about next steps and that assessment is consistent across school.

Values:
