Dear Parents,

Welcome back and I hope you all had a wonderful summer break! It has been a delight to see the children back in school.

Our topic for the Autumn term is 'Through the Ages': this project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.

Hom<u>ework</u>

Each week there will be maths and spelling set, normally on a Monday, which will be due in on Friday of that week. This will not be set for a couple of weeks in order for the children to settle back into school. In addition, there will also be tasks which are related to our topic which will keep the children engaged.

It is encouraged that children practice their times tables through TT Rockstars and spellings through the Spelling Shed app. Instructions and logins will be sent home with the children in due course.

Reading

Reading at home is essential and as we are now using the GoRead app, we hope that this gives the children even more reason to build that love for reading and to also explore different texts. Reading and being read to is fundamental to children's learning potential. Reading for pleasure can benefit a child's education, social and cognitive development, their wellbeing and their mental health.

Year 3 children will need to read a minimum of 4 times per week to get their book signed and earn their rainbow reading rewards. Recording of their reading can be done via the GoRead app where either the child or adult can mark the pages read from/to.

Curriculum Overview.

English – Narratives, chronological reports instructions and cinquains

Maths – Place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division

Science – animals including humans

RE – Being Human (Hinduism)

Topic (Geography/History/ICT/ D&T/ Art)- Through the Ages

PE

PE days are **Monday and Wednesday** however this can change, so please ensure your child has the correct, fully labelled, PE kit with them at all times. PE kit should include: T-shirt, shorts, plimsolls, trainers, socks and a tracksuit for when the weather becomes cooler.

Please support your child by ensuring that their PE kit is fully labelled.

Water Bottles

Children may bring a bottle of water only into the classroom. Lunchtime drinks will be kept in lockers.

<u>Evergreen</u>

At the end of each week on a Friday afternoon the children will be rewarded with some free time during Evergreen. The children are aware of unacceptable behaviour and are given a reminder then a warning, if this occurs more than once in a day they will take a green slip to the Head teacher and they will lose their Evergreen. Certain behaviours deemed to be severe can result in losing their Evergreen immediately. Children will have chance to earn some of their Evergreen time back if they demonstrate impeccable behaviour. Positive behaviour is rewarded with team points, certificates, positive praise and their Evergreen treat.
