Dear Parents,

Welcome back and I hope you all had a wonderful summer break! It has been a delight to see the children back in school.

Our topic for the Autumn term is The Stone, Bronze & Iron Age: this project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.

Homework

Each week there will be maths and spelling set, normally on a Monday, which will be due in on Friday of that week. Homework will start from next week commencing the 11th. In addition, there will also be tasks which are related to our topic which will keep the children engaged.

It is encouraged that children practice their times tables through TT Rockstars and spellings through the Spelling Shed app. Instructions and logins will be sent home with the children in due course.

Reading

Reading at home is essential and as we are now using the GoRead app, we hope that this gives the children even more reason to build that love for reading and to also explore different texts. Reading and being read to is fundamental to children's learning potential. Reading for pleasure can benefit a child's education, social and cognitive development, their wellbeing and their mental health.

Recording of their reading can be done via the GoRead app where either the child or adult can mark the pages read from/to. We will be encouraging the children to also record their reading using the GoRead app on their tablet at school.

Curriculum Overview.

English – Description of character, diary entry, continuation of narrative, letter and poetry

Maths – Place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division

Science – animals including humans and rocks

RE – Being Human (Hinduism)

D&T – cooking and nutrition followed by textiles

Computing – computing systems and networks and creating media

Our PE day is currently Wednesday, however this can change, so please ensure your child has the correct, fully labelled, PE kit with them at all times. PE kit should include: T-shirt, shorts, plimsolls, trainers, socks and a tracksuit for when the weather becomes cooler. Please support your child by ensuring that their PE kit is fully labelled.

In addition, your child will also attend swimming lessons on a Monday afternoon therefore can they please bring in the appropriate clothing and towel on this day.

Water Bottles

Children may bring a bottle of water only into the classroom. Lunchtime drinks will be kept in lockers.

Evergreer

At the end of each week on a Friday afternoon the children will be rewarded with some free time during Evergreen. The children are aware of unacceptable behaviour and are given a reminder then a warning, if this occurs more than once in a day they will take a green slip to the Head teacher and they will lose their Evergreen. Certain behaviours deemed to be severe can result in losing their Evergreen immediately. Children will have chance to earn some of their Evergreen time back if they demonstrate impeccable behaviour. Positive behaviour is rewarded with team points, certificates, positive praise and their Evergreen treat.
